**SPIRE NURSERY AND INFANT SCHOOL AND SPIRE JUNIOR SCHOOL ARE BOTH SITUATED ON DERBY ROAD IN CHESTERFIELD WITHIN A FEW MINUTES WALKING DISTANCE OF EACH OTHER. BOTH SCHOOLS OCCUPY SPACIOUS SITES WITH PLAYGROUNDS AND SPORTS FIELDS.**

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## CURRICULUM

### Nursery

The Curriculum for the Nursery is based on the Department for Education's 'Early Learning Goals' and covers six areas of learning

These six areas are offered through indoor and outdoor provision using a range of themes that stimulate young children's interest.

In addition, children are offered focussed learning opportunities to further develop language, literacy, numeracy and social skills.

The Nursery is staffed by fully qualified teachers and nursery nurses with each child being allocated a Key worker..

### Spire Infant School Key Stage 1

This consists of four core subjects English, Mathematics, Science and Information Communication Technology and six Foundation subjects Art, Music, PE, Design Technology, History and Geography as well as Religious Education and Personal Social Health and Citizenship Education. Subjects are taught according to the National Curriculum using a range of themes that appeal to children including "Dinosaurs" and " Superheroes"

### Spire Junior School Key Stage 2

The teaching is based on the National Curriculum for Key Stage Two. Children are taught Mathematics, English, Science, Information and Communication Technology, Religious Education, History, Geography, Physical Education, Music, Art, Design Technology, French and Personal Social Health and Citizenship Education.

We believe that a creative approach to the curriculum enables all children to learn effectively.

### Assessments

Regular assessments and target setting help us to make sure that every child receives the best possible education, which is appropriate to their individual needs.

At the end of Y6, children are assessed in the core subjects of Mathematics, English and Science.

In addition to this children are effectively monitored termly and at the end of each academic year to ensure anticipated progress is being made throughout both schools.

### Homework

We believe that children will benefit from a shared approach to education so we will support parents/carers in continuing the education process at home. Children are asked to read at home, practice letters, spellings and multiplication tables and as they continue into Key Stage 2, more extended activities related to the curriculum.

### Learning Support

At Spire Nursery and Infant School and Spire Junior School we aim to ensure that every child reaches their full potential across the whole school curriculum. There is a firm commitment to supporting children by removing barriers to learning and promoting inclusion wherever possible.

We encourage all parents of children with special needs to visit and discuss our provision and their child's particular requirements. Both schools are accessible by children with mobility difficulties.

We aim to ensure that each child's needs are identified and met. Where necessary, and with parental consent, help will be sought from other agencies, including the health services, advisory teachers, therapists and psychologists.

Partnership with parents is essential if we are to meet children's needs: we recognise that parents have a central role as the child's educator and we aim to support parents in this role. Parents are consulted at all steps with regard to any special needs their child may have.

### Gifted and Talented

Both schools work in partnership with other local schools to ensure that children with particular gifts and talents are recognised and given appropriate additional learning opportunities.





## FURTHER OPPORTUNITIES

## WORKING TOGETHER WITH PARENTS

### Reports and Parents Evenings

Reports are sent to all parents annually in the summer term. Parent Consultations are held three times a year for all children. Parents/carers will be invited to come into school to discuss children's progress and to look closely at their work.

### Behaviour

We are all concerned with the well-being and overall development of the children in our care.

We aim to create a happy atmosphere where children are encouraged to be independent, self-disciplined and to show respect for others, both in and out of school.

Our Behaviour Policies outline school rules, and possible rewards for good behaviour and consequences for unacceptable behaviour. We work closely with parents to ensure the success of children in this important matter.

### Anti-Bullying

Our schools take bullying very seriously and participate in specific anti-bullying work to create safer environments for all children. Success has been recognised by both schools receiving anti-bullying awards from the Derbyshire LEA "ABC" scheme.

### Attendance

Research has shown that regular attendance at school improves attainment. We are confident that all parents will support us in making sure their child attends regularly and on time. Both schools operate a first-day response system and parents can help by making sure they contact the school to keep us informed of reasons for absence. Both schools celebrate good attendance with regular awards.



# ETHOS

## School Uniform

Both Governing Bodies believe that the wearing of school uniform promotes a positive image for Spire Schools and helps to create a high quality learning environment. The recommended code of dress has been agreed by Governors and offers a smart, economical and functional way to clothe children for school.

## School Councils

Spire Nursery and Infant School and Spire Junior School have school councils, made up of children representing each class, who are actively involved in the decision-making processes of the schools. The school councils meet on a regular basis, which allows all children to "have a say". The ideas and views of these meetings are given serious consideration by staff and Governors.

We view parents and school staff as partners in the education of our children; we build on the work parents do, and we value their help in ensuring all children reach their potential.



# CONTINUITY OF EDUCATION

**SPIRE NURSERY AND INFANT SCHOOL AND SPIRE JUNIOR SCHOOL WORK VERY CLOSELY TOGETHER TO ENSURE THE BEST POSSIBLE EDUCATION ACROSS THE KEY STAGES FOR THE CHILDREN IN OUR COMMUNITY.**

We believe that the transition between each phase of education should be as efficient as possible for the benefit of all children. We provide regular opportunities for children to take part in joint activities throughout the year. In the summer term, Y2 children spend the day at Spire Junior School to be ready for September. Staff at both schools work closely together to make sure that the move from Y2 to Y3 is as smooth as possible and that the high standards achieved in Spire Infant School are maintained.

We also have a close relationship with the Secondary Schools in our area. The majority of our children transfer to Parkside Community School with a small minority going to Hasland Community School. Transition programmes are in place for both Schools.
